OASAS Medicaid Re-Design Team Permanent Housing Program

The MRT Housing Program is a partnership between OASAS and Central New York Services, Inc. It was designed to enable individuals with a risk of homelessness and chronic substance abuse to obtain and remain in safe and affordable permanent housing.

Program components include rental subsidies and other occupancy costs for apartments, program supervision, housing counseling services, employment counseling services and clinical supervision for direct care staff.

Program Goals

The primary goals for participants are:

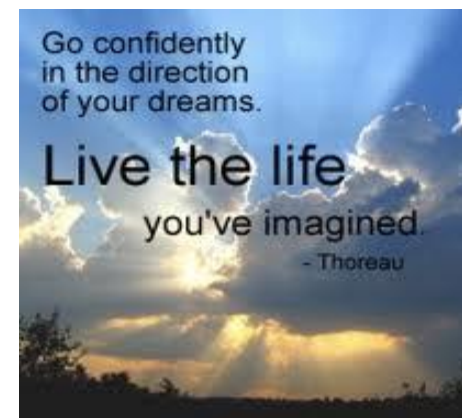
- Obtain and remain in safe and affordable permanent housing
- Link to mainstream benefits, community resources, and support services
- Increase skills and/or income

Program Goals (continued)

- Increase skills and/or income
- Achieve greater self-determination and independence

Admission / Eligibility Requirements

- Must have a substance abuse diagnosis
- Must be actively on Medicaid
- Must have a history of 2 inpatient hospitalizations/rehab stays, or 5 emergency room/detox visits within the past 12 months
- Recommended to enroll in Central New York Health Home for additional case management
- Must be a single adult living alone
- Must have a history of or be at risk for homelessness
